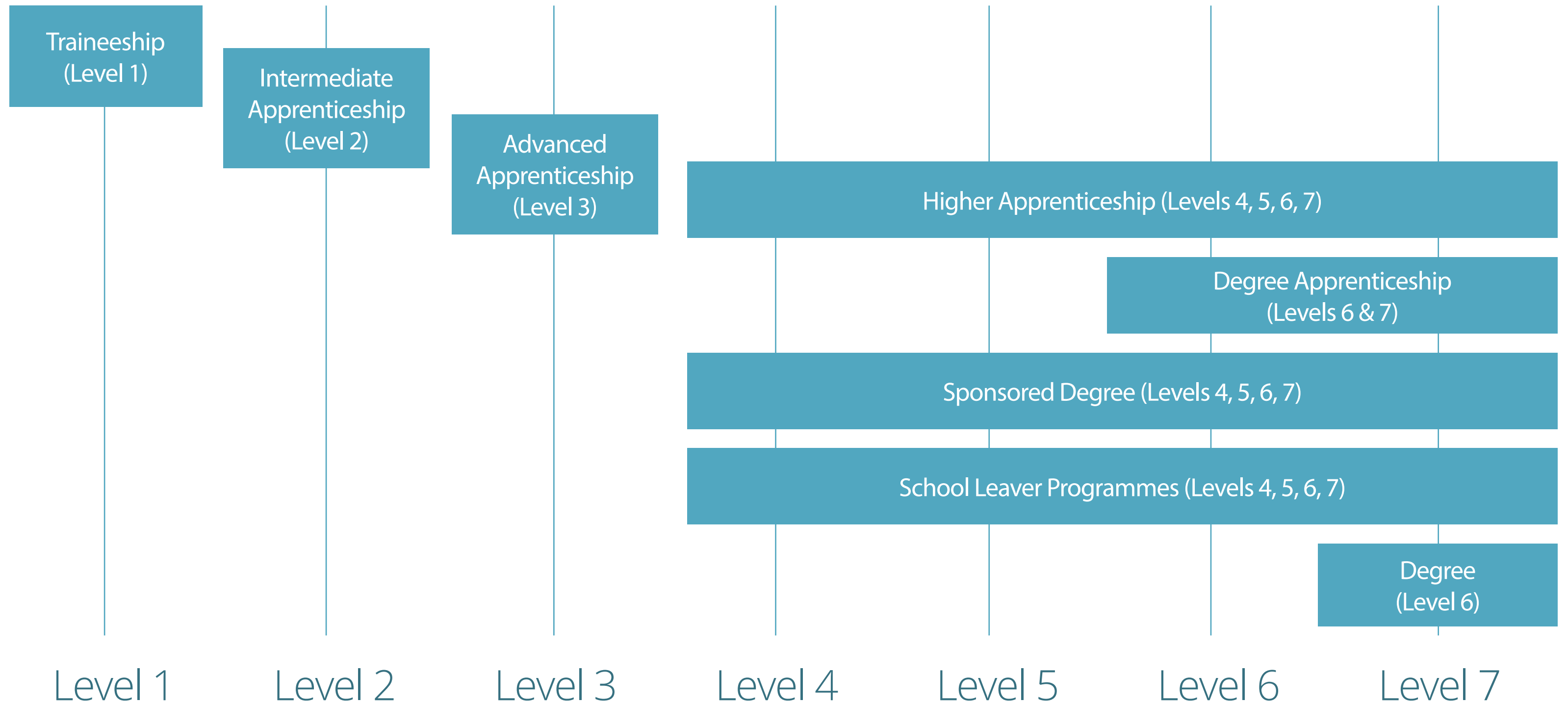

Degree Apprenticeships: context

85,590 Intermediate Apprenticeship starts in 2017/18

88,880 Advanced Apprenticeship starts

17,590 Levels 4 & 5 Higher Apprenticeship starts

6,230 Degree Apprenticeship starts

One in three of all English 18-year-olds secured university places

Degree Apprenticeships: Trailblazers

Groups of businesses, universities & colleges

Bespoke degree courses

skills and experience relevant to that particular industry
